Topical Study: Jesus

In order to begin to understand Jesus Christ, it is necessary to explore His deity and His humanity.

1. Read Hebrews 1:1-14.
 - What is one fact about Jesus that enables Him to reveal God (verse 3)? There are more than one.
 - What is Jesus' relationship to the angels (verses 4-6,13,14)?
 - How does God address Jesus (verses 8,10)?
 - How is Jesus described as God (verses 8-12)?
2. What did Jesus claim for Himself? John 10:28-30
3. Jesus Himself claimed that He was God. If this claim were not true, He could not be called even a good man, but would be an imposter and a liar. While on earth, Jesus performed many miracles which clearly demonstrated His divine power. For examples of these miracles read Matthew 8. What did Jesus do in John 11:39-44 that revealed His unique divine power?

Fulfilled prophecy helps verify the fact that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God. Looking at the prophecies which preceded Jesus by hundreds of years and seeing how Jesus fulfilled them in every detail reveals the authenticity of His claims. The chart below is a brief list of some of the prophecies made concerning the Christ and how Jesus fulfills them.

TOPIC	PROPHECY	FULFILLMENT
Place of birth	Micah 5:2 (700 B.C.)	Matthew 2:1
Born of a virgin	Isaiah 7:14 (700 B.C.)	Matthew 1:18
His triumphal entry	Zechariah 9:9 (500 B.C.)	John 12:13,14
Betrayal by a friend	Psalms 41:9 (1000 B.C.)	Mark 14:10
His rejection	Isaiah 53:3 (700 B.C.)	John 1:11
Crucified with sinners	Isaiah 53:12 (700 B.C.)	Matthew 27:38
Hands and feet pierced	Psalms 22:16 (1000 B.C.)	John 20:27
His resurrection	Psalms 16:10 (1000 B.C.)	Acts 3:15
His ascension	Psalms 68:18 (1000 B.C.)	Acts 1:9
