What Motivates Us - verses 3-6

- 1. What was the motivation of the "wannabe" leaders and teachers in the Ephesian church?
- 2. How does Paul describe the results of their self-focused motivation?
- 3. Is it possible to look at the relationships of a congregation and to discern the heart focus of the membership?
- 4. What do you think the relationships at Creekside indicate about our heart focus?

Four Principles of Contentment - verses 7-11

1. You can't take it with you - verse 7

- 1) What is Paul's point in verse 7?
- 2) In Luke 12:16-21 what is Jesus saying about the permanence of wealth and the focus of our lives?
- 3) In Matthew 6:19-21 how can we tell where our heart is focused?
- 4) How can understanding Paul's truth in verse 7 lead to contentment?

2. God takes care of His own - verse 8

- 1) In Matthew 6:25-32 what does Jesus say concerning God's care for us?
- 2) How can this realization lead to contentment?
- 3) These days, what does living according to this truth look like in your life?

3. You can't buy happiness - verses 9,10

- 1) What is the temptation that Paul is writing of in verse 9?
- 2) Are there other ways, than desiring to be rich, to fall into this temptation?
- 3) How can we avoid being trapped by this temptation?
- 4) In verse 10, what is the root of all sorts of evil?
- 5) What might this look like in the day-to-day of where we live our lives?
- 6) Consider James 5:1-6 and Jesus' teaching in Matthew 25:31-46 (especially verse 45). What effect does our financial stewardship have on us? On others?

4. Chose to Pursue God - verse 11

- 1) In verse 11, what does Paul tell Timothy?
- 2) What does it mean to "flee" and "pursue"?
- 3) What Godly characteristics is Timothy to pursue? How would you describe each of these?
- 4) In Matthew 6:33,34, what does Jesus say that we should seek? Why?
- 5) How can the pursuit of Godly character and the Kingdom of God lead to contentment?
- 6) These days what does "fleeing" look like for you?
- 7) These days what does "pursuing" look like for you?

Extra Credit

- 1. The opposite of contentment is covetousness. True or False? Why or why not?
- 2. How are both contentment and covetousness related to our relationship with God?
- 3. How might Paul's instructions to Timothy help us to be satisfied with what God has given us (in comparison with others)?
- 4. How does our contentment with God's blessing and plan for our lives display the glory of God to those around us?
