

The Truth About Jesus Colossians 1:15-23



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The Pre-eminence of Jesus in Creation (verses 15-17)

Quick Definition: Preeminence = having first place. In verses 15 to 20 Paul describes what it means that Jesus is pre-eminent.

- 1. In verse 15, what does Paul mean by "He is the image of the invisible God"?
- 2. In verse 16, how does Paul describe Jesus being "the firstborn of all creation"?
- 3. In verses 16 and 17, what does Paul mean by all things being created "by", "through", and "for" Him?
- 4. Why do you think Paul is stressing the pre-eminence of Jesus in Creation?
- 5. What does it mean to you personally that Jesus is pre-eminent in creation?

The Pre-eminence of Jesus in Redemption (verses 18-20)

Quick Definition: Redemption = a market term denoting the act of purchase especially in the slave market. While "salvation" describes deliverance, redemption is more specific denoting the means by which salvation is achieved.

- 6. In verse 18, what does Paul mean by "He is the head of the body, the church"?
- 7. In verse 18, what does Paul mean by *"He is the beginning"*? What is the Jesus the beginning of? How does Paul go on to describe this truth?
- 8. In verse 19, what does Paul mean by "in Him all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell"?
- 9. Thinking through the answer to question #8, what is the importance to our redemption that Jesus is fully man and fully God?
- 10. Why do you think Paul is stressing the pre-eminence of Jesus in redemption?
- 11. What does it mean to you personally that Jesus is pre-eminent in redemption?

The Position of the Believer in Jesus (verses 21-23)

Quick Definition: Reconciled = the change of personal relations between human beings or between God and man.

- 12. In verse 21, how does Paul describe our relationship with God prior to reconciliation?
- 13. In verses 22, how does Paul describe our relationship with God since we have been reconciled?
- 14. How do you know that what Paul describes is in fact true?
- 15. In verse 23, what does Paul mean by *"if indeed you continue in the faith"*? Put another way, what would happen if one did not *"continue in the faith"*?
- 16. How does Paul describe what it means to continue in the faith?
- 17. What might continuing in the faith look like for you?
- 18. How might our Life Group be supportive of you as you continue?
