- 1. As we have been going through Daniel, what has God been showing you about...
 - a. The spiritual battle we are in?
 - b. Your role in that battle where and how God has called you to serve Him?

The Time of the End (verses 1-4)

- 1. Is there anything about "the time of the end" that troubles you? Excites you?
- 2. Verses 1 and 2 teach that every one of us is on a trajectory towards one of two possible eternal destinations: Heaven (everlasting life) or Hell (shame and everlasting contempt). How do the following verses describe and/or contrast these destinations?
 - a. Matthew 13:40-43:
 - b. Revelation 20:10-15:
 - c. Revelation 21:1-8, 21-27:
 - d. Revelation 22:1-5:
- According to verse 1, what is required for us to be on the trajectory leading to everlasting life?
- 4. How would you explain to someone how their name can be "found in the book"?

Final Instructions (verses 9-13)

- 1. What do you think of the angel's answer to Daniel's question?
- 2. In verse 13 Daniel is told to "go your way till the end." How might this instruction apply to you as well?
- 3. In verse 13, what is the promise given to Daniel?
- 4. What is the meaning of this promise?
- 5. What encouragement is there for you in what God has promised Daniel and His people?

Processing All That...

- 1. Consider the summary points given in today's message. How might each of these truths personally effect you?
 - a. Chapter One: We are God's people. Courage comes as we learn to see ourselves as God sees us.
 - b. Chapter Two: We are given a glimpse of God's sovereignty. Courage comes as we remember that the sovereign God is in control over the wavering affairs of human history even the events of our lives.
 - c. Chapter Three: We are given a choice. Courage comes as we choose to value God above circumstances.
 - d. Chapter Four: Nebuchadnezzar gets pasteurized. Courage comes when God rules over our hearts.
 - e. Chapter Five: The handwriting on the wall. Courage comes as we allow God to fill us (supply our deepest needs).
 - f. Chapter Six: The Lions' Den. Courage and opportunity and blessing come as we totally rely on God.
 - g. Chapters Seven through Twelve: Prophecy is about God and His people. Prophecy is given to move us closer to God to encourage and motivate God's people to trust Him.
