- 1. What insight, principle, or observation from this message did you find to be the most helpful, eye-opening, or troubling? Explain.
- 2. How have you seen the lack of strong fathers affecting this generation?
- 3. Which of the resolution's "I Will" commitments challenges you the most?
- 4. How has your relationship (or lack of) with your father affected your life? Your view of God?
- 5. In your opinion, what factors are undermining the influence of fathers?
- 6. In verse 14 how does Joshua tell God's people to serve God?
- 7. What does it mean to serve God in sincerity and faithfulness?
- 8. What could this look like in your life?

- 9. In verse 14 Joshua tells God's people to, "Put away the gods that your fathers served beyond the River and in Egypt." Most of us do not have little clay figurines at home that we worship. However, what we give a greater place to in our lives (or choose to serve) rather than the God becomes "a god" in our lives. Can a god be a sin? Or, a past failure? Or, a wrong done against you? An attitude?
- 10. What might the equivalent of these "gods" be in your life?
- 11. Why do you think it is important to "put away" these gods?
- 12. How can the cross of Christ enable us to put away the gods of our past?
- 13. Joshua's resolution in verse 15 involves choosing to take personal responsibility for his own actions before God and others. What could this kind of personal responsibility look like in your life?
- 14. The setting of Joshua 24:14,15 involves a transition between generations. Joshua's death is immanent and the leadership of the nation will be changing. What kind of legacy did Joshua leave God's people?
- 15. What do you think your legacy will be?
