



Luke 6:37-42 / Judgment & Hypocrisy

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Easy warm-up questions (choose one)

1. What have you recently purchased that was the worst rip off and/or let down and/or waste of money?
2. What movie or TV program have you seen recently that was an absolute bust?

Main Idea (6:37,38): “Judge Not!!!!”

1. It is never right to judge someone else. TRUE FALSE
2. What does Jesus mean by “Judge not”?
3. What does Jesus mean by “Condemn not”?
4. What does Jesus mean by “Give, and it will be given to you”?
5. What promise can we hang on to as we “give” as Jesus instructs us to give?
6. These days, what parts of Jesus’ teaching (verses 37,38) do you find easier/harder to follow? Why?

Main Idea (6:39-42): Choose wisely who you’re going to follow.

1. According to Jesus, what is the danger of following a blind man? What does He mean by this?
2. Why would anyone choose to follow a blind man? Are there examples of this that you see happening today?
3. What does Jesus mean by “a disciple is not above his teacher”?
4. What reason would Jesus have for calling out His disciples as hypocrites?
5. Have you ever felt like you were “acting” as a hypocrite?
6. It is impossible to avoid being a hypocrite. TRUE FALSE

Processing all that... Implications:

1. What can we do to keep from falling into the “pit” of being self-deceived?
2. What can we do to keep from falling into the “pit” of comparison?
3. Thinking back through what Jesus teaches (the character qualities He describes and the implications for our relationship with God He points us to), what qualifies someone as being worthy to follow? Who have you known who met these qualifications?
4. Ultimately, what does all of the above have to do with what it means to be a true disciple of Jesus?

Going farther...
