EASY WARM-UP QUESTIONS

- 1. Have you ever been called for Jury Duty?
 - 1) Did you have to serve? If so, what was that like?
 - 2) Were you excused? If so, what were the circumstances?

JESUS' TRIAL 14:53-65

- 1. Jesus' trial before Caiaphas was a perversion of justice. Why and how?
- 2. Why was it necessary to have more than one witness? (consider also Deuteronomy 7:6)
- 3. Would you personally convict someone based on the testimony of only one witness? (consider if that testimony was electronic i.e. a computer record or video)
- 4. A related question: Have you ever convicted someone based on the testimony of only one witness? (Gossip? Rumor? A posting?) Why or why not?
- 5. What does Jesus' silence help you to understand about Jesus? (consider also 1 Peter 2:23)
- 6. Recorded in verse 61 is the question that Jesus did answer.
 - 1) Why did Caiaphas ask this question?
 - 2) Why did Jesus choose to answer this question?
 - 3) What does Jesus' answer help you to understand about Jesus? (consider also Daniel 7:13,14)
- These days, how might Jesus' trust in the Father be of encouragement to you?

PETER'S DENIAL 14:66-72

- In what ways was Peter faithful to Jesus?
- What does this (answer to question #1) help you to understand about Peter?
- 3. Why do you think Peter denied his association with Jesus?
- 4. These days, in what ways can you identify with Peter?

PROCESSING ALL THAT

- 1. These days, what does it mean for you to come to where Peter was?
- How might Psalm 130:1-8 (especially verses 3-5) be of encouragement to you?
- 3. These days, what does it mean for you to be where Jesus is?

SUPER BONUS EXTRA CREDIT QUESTIONS

- 1. Thinking back to Mark 14:32-42, how do you think that Jesus' time at Gethsemane helped to prepare Him for this trial?
- 2. These days, how might you follow Jesus' example as you anticipate trials in your life?
