Mark 9:1-13

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A HINGE 9:1

- 1. There are a number of events recorded in Scripture which some feel are allegories, or stories that didn't actually happen (at least not in the way they're recorded). For example: Adam & Eve or Jonah and the whale. Why is it important to realize that Scripture presents these as true historical narratives?
- 2. Thinking about Jesus' transfiguration, how significant is it to Mark's readers that this actually took place? What about to the disciples? What about to you?

JESUS' TRANSFIGURATION 9:2-4

- 1. What in Mark's description helps you to understand more about Jesus?
- 2. How is this understanding helpful to you?

PETER'S RESPONSE 9:5,6

- 1. Have you ever said something and then wished you hadn't?
- 2. What is the most likely reason Peter said what Peter said?
- 3. What might have been a better response?

GOD REBUKES PETER 9:7,8

- 1. What does God's rebuke help you to understand about Jesus?
- 2. How might this understanding be helpful to you personally?

JESUS' CHARGE & QUESTIONS 9:9-13

- 1. What does Jesus tell Peter, James, and John not to do? Why?
- 2. In your own words, what was it that Peter, James, and John didn't understand?
- 3. In your own words, what was the point of Jesus' response to their question?
- 4. How might Jesus' response to Peter, James, and John be of help to you when you are uncertain of what God is up to?

PROCESSING ALL THAT...

- 1. In today's passage, what is especially helpful for you to hang on to? Why?
- These days, what does it look like for you to be silent before God?
- 3. These days, what steps are you taking to focus more on Who Jesus is?
