Psalm 24:1-10

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Yahweh, The Creator King (verses 1,2)

1. In verse 1, what belongs to God? What does this truth have to do with us? How might this truth change how we live our lives?
2. In verse 2, what is the reason everything belongs to God? How might this truth influence how we view our relationship with God?
3. How might the truths of verses 1 and 2 change our relationship with God?
4. Why does it seem so easy to resist living as God's possession?

Yahweh, The Holy King (verses 3-6)

5. What do these verses teach us about God?
6. How do these verses describe our efforts to approach God? Doable? Futile? Dangerous? Other...?
7. What does it mean to seek God? Are there prerequisites for seeking God? How are you seeking God?
8. How does verse 5 describe God's response to those who are seeking Him - even those who mess up and fall into sin?
9. Does God's response make sense? Put another way, what does God's response tell us about God (His character) and what He wills for us?

Yahweh, The Glorious King (verses 7-10)

10. After reading these verses how would you answer the question: "Who is this King of glory"?
11. Is there any part of this description that stands out to you as particularly significant? Any part of the description that is personally meaningful to you?
12. How are God's people to respond to the King of glory (verses 7,9)? What might this response look like in your life?
13. Revelation 19:11-16 gives us a different perspective of Jesus and His second coming to Jerusalem. What impresses you about this description.
14. Zechariah 14:9 describes what response to Jesus?
15. Do you think that Zechariah 14:9 describes an appropriate response to the truths of Psalm 24?
16. How might you respond in worship of Jesus?
17. Is there any part of this study which has helped you in your understanding of Jesus and your perspective of Who He is as the King riding into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday? What might you do to incorporate this new understanding / perspective into your life?
