Easy warm-up questions (choose one)

1. If you had 3 minutes to evacuate your house, what would you take?
2. What was one of your favorite movie endings (one you can watch over and over and never get tired of)? What about the ending do you love?

Thinking about 20:1-10: “What’s up with the 1,000 years?” & “Why let Satan out?”

1. What do you think is the point of God binding Satan and then releasing him?
2. What is Satan’s battle plan before he is bound? What is Satan’s battle plan after his release? What does this help you to understand about Satan?
3. How does John describe those who will be deceived by Satan?
4. What can we do to keep from being deceived by Satan?
5. Who sits on the thrones? Why? Why do you think knowing this might have been helpful to John’s readers?
6. These days, how is knowing this helpful to you?
7. Who returns with Jesus? Why do you think knowing this might have been helpful to John’s readers?
8. These days, how is knowing this helpful for you?

Thinking about 20:11-15 “What practical significance does this have for me today?”

1. You cannot believe in a God of love if you do not believe in hell. Agree Disagree
2. Why do you think some people seem to resist the idea of final judgment?
3. What experiences or teaching have influenced your thoughts about hell?
4. Who do you think should be in hell? Who deserves it? Do you think some people deserve it more than others?
5. Who gets judged? Why? On what basis?
6. What is the significance of the Book of Life?
7. How does someone get their name written in the Book of Life? (Be careful how you answer this question. The answer may not be as obvious as you think. Stumped? Consider Ephesians 2:8,9)
8. What assurance do you have that your name is written in the Book of Life?

Homework (suggestions for going farther)

1. How might this study help you to follow Jesus through the circumstances of your life?
2. Who do you know who needs to know about what we’ve studied?
3. This week, read Revelation 21:1-27.
