## Revelation 4:1-11 / *The Authority of The Lamb*

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### Homework

1. This past week, did you read Revelation 4:1-11 out loud? (40 points)

### Easy warm-up question

(which may have nothing to do with the text, but is helpful in helping us get to know each other...)

1. Where did you go to school for the first grade?

### “After this...” (4:1)

1. What does John mean by “after this...”? What does Jesus mean by “after this”?
2. What is the urgency associated with what comes “after this”?
3. These days, what does this urgency mean to you personally?

### “And behold a throne...” (4:2-11)

1. In these verses, aside from Jesus, what stands out to you as especially significant?
2. What do these verses help you to understand about Jesus?
3. These days, how does/might your response to Jesus be like that of those in heaven?

### Processing all that...

Jesus, the Lamb of God, is the Authority, to Whom belongs all the authority over our lives.

1. These days, what does it mean for you to see Jesus at the center?
2. These days, what are you doing to keep Jesus at the center?
3. These days, what are you doing to remember that Jesus is the center?
4. If you haven't touched on the following yet: In thinking through your answers to the above questions (#'s 1-3), with which (if not with all) of these have you experienced the presence and power of God? What was that like?
5. If you haven't touched on the following yet: In thinking through your answers to the above questions (#'s 1-3), which (if not with all) of these do you struggle with the most?
6. In thinking through our responses to the above questions (#'s 1-5), how might we as a group help each other to “see” and “keep” Jesus at the center and to “remember” that He is the center?
7. How might today's study help you to become more dependent on Jesus?

2. Extra Credit: Read ahead - Revelation 5:1-14 (out loud)
3. Extra Extra Credit: Read Revelation 1-22 (out loud)

\* The interpretation of these seven churches as being symbolic of periods of Church history is dispensational in origin. The seven churches are seen as having characteristics typical of the character of the Church of Christ from the end of the First Century down to the time of Christ's return for His Church. They are seen as descriptive of "the things which are" (Revelation 1:19). While only God can be certain as to the veracity of this interpretation, it is intriguing and carries weight which makes it worthy of consideration and response.
