Owe only love (verses 8-10)

- 1. What does Paul mean by, "Owe no one anything"?
- 2. What does Paul mean by telling us to owe only love to each other?
- 3. How is it possible to obey the commandments and still not fulfill the requirements of the law?
- 4. How does loving others fulfill the law?
- 5. How is the quality of love Paul writes about different than the "love" found in our culture?
- 6. In what ways have you seen this quality of love (Paul's quality of love) demonstrated by Christians?

Time is short (verses 11-14)

- 1. What does Paul mean by "the hour has come for you to wake"?
- 2. What does it mean to "wake up"? Why is crucial that we wake up?
- 3. What does it mean to "cast off the works of darkness"?
- 4. These days, what are you doing to cast off the works darkness in your life?
- 5. What does it mean to "put on the Lord Jesus Christ"?
- 6. These days, what are you doing to put on the Lord Jesus Christ in your life?
- 7. Consider Galatians 5:16-26 and Philippians 4:8,9. How might these passages help you to "cast off" and "put on"?
- 8. How can we (this group) help each other to "cast off" and "put on"?

- 1. Pray proactively:
 - What does it mean to pray proactively?
 - These days, how are you praying proactively for others?
- 2. Cultivate relationships:
 - What does it mean to cultivate relationships?
 - These days, how are you cultivating relationships?
- 3. Look for opportunities:
 - What does it mean to look for opportunities?
 - These days, how are you looking for opportunities?
