

To God Be The Glory

Romans 15:1-13

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As we have been Roaming Through Romans, it has been noted that the church of Rome was a diverse group that, humanly speaking, should not have existed. Take time to consider our group and our congregation.

- 1. Consider and share with each other your family background. Where did you family originate from? How many generations have you been in this country? How important was/is your ethnic background to you today? Where were you born and raised?
- 2. Consider your spiritual background. Were you raised Roman Catholic, Protestant (Baptist, Lutheran, Presbyterian...) or with some other spiritual background (or not)? How important was/is your spiritual background to you today? What were the circumstances of your trusting Jesus as your Savior?
- 3. Do you think that our group's composition is representative of the congregation as a whole? Why or why not?
- 4. Do you think our differences as a congregation are a strength or a weakness? Why or why not?

Our Obligation (verses 1-6)

- 1. According to Paul, what is our obligation to each other? Why does that obligation exist?
- 2. Thinking through Paul's two examples (verses 2-4), what heart level attitudes do we need to have in order to fulfill our obligation?
- 3. These days, how are you doing at bearing up your siblings in Jesus?

Our Welcome (verses 7-13)

- 1. What does Paul mean by "welcome one another"? What is the reason Paul gives for our needing to do this?
- 2. Given the "diversity" of the church in Rome (and the divisions/conflicts they were experiencing), how well do you think they received Paul's instruction? What changes in their actions/attitudes do you think they may have needed to make?
- 3. How does welcoming each other help us to "bear up" each other?
- 4. These days, how well do you think we as a congregation are doing at welcoming/accepting each other? How do you think we might become more welcoming/accepting?
- 5. Where does the ability to bear up each other come from? How does God get the glory when we live according to Paul's teaching?

Extra Credit

- 1. Apart from the working of God, do you think our group and/or congregation should exist? What do you think is God's purpose in bringing us together?
- 2. How well do you think we as a congregation do at working through conflict (or areas of division)? Why or why not?
- 3. How do you think we might prepare ourselves now for our adversary's next "sucker punch" attempt at creating division and distraction from God's purposes for us.
